Reasons for crisis included:

- BEREAVEMENT
- FAMILY BREAKDOWN THROUGH DOMESTIC VIOLENCE
- BENEFIT DELAY
- INTRODUCTION OF UNIVERSAL CREDIT (clients waiting 5 weeks + without any money)
- LOSS OF A JOB
- ILLNESS BOTH PHYSICAL & MENTAL

Figures released by the national foodbank charity revealed that it handed out 1,583,668 3 day emergency food parcels from April 2018 to March 2019.

The charity also reported that over half a million 577,618 of these were to children. It is noted that this is an 18.8% increase on the previous year. The rise is largely due to the 5 week wait for the universal credit payment, it is reported that nearly

half 49% of all food bank referrals are made because of benefit payment delays linked to universal credit, 20% of people needed help because of added delays to benefit payment. 33% of people need emergency food because benefit payments “consistently” don’t cover the basic cost of living. A further 17% needed help because of changes in benefits.

These figures do not include the over 800 independent food banks like New Hope.

CASE STUDY SPRING 2020 (name changed to protect identity)

Michelle was referred to our furniture project by one of the front line referrers who was involved in her case.

This particular referrer deals with people under the age of 18 who require outside assistance and support whilst undergoing desperate circumstances without existing support from family and friends.

Michelle is 18 years old and had been in a Domestic Violence situation for the previous 18 months. She found the courage to flee to a women's refuge. Because of the seriousness of the Domestic Violence, after only 4 months she was relocated to a new home in our area which is a considerable distance from her home town. She arrived to a property with limited possessions and no family or friends for support.

We were able through generous donations to support her through the furniture project and give her wardrobes, chest of drawers, television and stand, washing machine, microwave and other items to help make this new property into a cosy home.

As is the usual case when people move into a council or housing association property the carpets have always been removed leaving a nasty cold, dark and depressing concrete floor. We approached a local foundation for funding for new carpets which they readily agreed to and it really was the icing on the cake.

As Michelle didn't know anyone in the area we invited her for lunch in the coffee shop and very quickly people took her under their wing, making her feel very welcome at New Hope. It wasn't long before she started volunteering in the charity shop and also joined in with the other ministries and groups as well.

It has been a pleasure to see how much Michelle has changed and grown in confidence over the last few months, she always has a smile on her face and is willing to help out with anything that needs doing.
